#### Trauma Designation a Long and Winding Road, Lavetta Kennedy, SBB, Technical Coordinator, Methodist Charlton Medical Center

- Presentation handouts attached, review for comprehensive information shared.
  - Attendee Questions/Comments
    - Does anyone use timers on coolers?
      - Yes, have purchased the timers that have a very audible beep and/or visual cue such as flashing lights.
      - One hospital has a magnetic board for the timer/cooler to alert staff of the time the cooler has been out from the blood bank.
      - How long can the cooler be out of the blood bank?
        - Validated for 12 hours, told 8 hours, but only sent out for 4 hours.
    - Have you thought of dispensing cryo in your trauma pack?
      - We only provide as requested from physician.
      - Comment from area hospital: We perform ROTEM testing in the transfusion service and if indicated, we send cryo in the shipment.
      - Comment from area hospital: We perform TEG in the laboratory and cryo is requested based on results. We prompt the physicians to order cryo when indicated.
      - Comment from area hospital: Also encourage the physicians to order cryo during MTP based on TEG results
    - Did you validate the use of liquid plasma? (Please find attached reference material regarding coagulation studies for liquid plasma.)
      - Yes, to ensure that the computer alerts were activated as necessary as the liquid plasma is Group A
      - Validated as emergency issue
    - Are coagulation studies performed prior to dispensing rFVIIa?
      - Dispensed from pharmacy not laboratory; so not sure
  - During the exercises have seen that the physicians are calling an MTP, when in reality all that is needed is 2 units of uncrossmatched blood. Have seen a lot of waste with the MTP.
    - Comment from area hospital: When we receive the call for MTP, we state so you want 40 units of Red Blood cells, 40 units of Plasma, and so forth. This helps the treating physician put into perspective what is really needed for the patient.

    - Please note that the Leukoreduction filter currently in use at Carter BloodCare is not platelet sparing; therefore, if you were interested in this product it would require use of a different filter

#### BacT/ALERT® culture system for platelet products

- Go live on November 20, 2017
- Any recommendations for notification to the treating physician?
  - Encourage physicians to ask CBC MDs
- Zika testing update
  - Roche assay is FDA licensed; expect that the Grifols platform will soon be licensed which means a potential fee increase
  - Once assay is licensed, then it is no longer required to label each product with Neg for Zika by investigational NAT
