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Blood Community Issues Joint Statement Urging Nation to Give Blood Ahead of World Blood Donor Day

America's Blood Centers (ABC), AABB, and the American Red Cross <u>issued</u> a joint statement on June 11th urging eligible individuals to donate blood. The national blood community recognized that, "[b]lood donations are critically needed now and throughout the summer to ensure availability of all blood types for patients in need. While summer can often be a challenging season for blood donations, blood collection organizations are facing a unique and concerning set of challenges this June. As the nation resumes some level of normalcy with progress in our battle against the pandemic, hospital need for blood is increasing. The majority of hospitals have resumed nonessential surgeries and patients throughout the U.S. are resuming treatment options that include the use of blood and blood components that were postponed during the past year."

The organizations encouraged eligible individuals "to make an appointment to donate blood now and throughout the summer. Doing so is essential to the availability of the nation's blood supply." The statement also explained that "[t]is month, the blood community celebrates World Blood Donor Day on June 14 and recognizes World Sickle Cell Awareness Day on June 19 by thanking all current and future blood donors for their altruism and encouraging eligible individuals to make a commitment to schedule appointments to donate throughout the summer. There is no substitute for blood or blood components which are a vital part of treatment options for the millions of individuals who require blood transfusions each year, including the more than 100,000 people suffering from sickle cell disease in the U.S. Blood donors are needed on a regular basis to continuously replenish the U.S. blood supply. Blood donation remains a safe way that eligible individuals can help save lives. Individuals who have received a COVID-19 vaccine currently authorized in the U.S...are able to donate blood and platelets as long as they are symptom-free and feeling well at the time of donation...Throughout the pandemic, blood collection organization have adapted their safety protocols to align with CDC guidance to ensure the safest possible experience for donors and staff. Right now, blood collection organizations across the nation need the support and generosity of blood donors to help save lives."

A PDF <u>version</u> of the statement is available of the ABC public site. Additional updates will be provided as they become available. ABC will also keep member blood centers informed of its national outreach efforts with the blood community and external stakeholders to communicate the status of the U.S. blood supply. CBER Updates 2021 Guidance Agenda

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research (CBER) has <u>published</u> an update to its guidance agenda for 2021. The agency outlines the guidance and draft guidance documents that CBER plans to issue throughout the year. The most recent update includes a notation on the Zika guidance that "[w]e are no longer pursuing this guidance. We issued an informational document regarding the risk of Zika virus transmission by blood and blood components and withdrew the July 2018 guidance in May 2021). Blood and blood components topics remain the same otherwise and are listed below:

- Compliance Policy Regarding Donation Suitability Requirements; Draft Guidance for Industry;
- Manufacture of Blood Components Using a Pathogen Reduction Device in Blood Establishments: Questions and Answers; Guidance for Industry;
- Blood Pressure and Pulse Donor Eligibility Requirements; Draft Guidance for Industry;
- Alternative Procedures for Cold-Stored Platelets Intended for Transfusion; Draft Guidance for Industry;
- Collection of Platelets by Automated Methods; Guidance for Industry;
- Investigational COVID-19 Convalescent Plasma; Guidance for Industry (*Issued in January and updated in February 2021*); and
- Revised Recommendations for Reducing Zika Virus Transmission by Blood and Blood Components; Guidance for Industry (FDA is no longer pursuing this guidance. The agency issued an informational document regarding the risk of Zika virus transmission by blood and blood components and withdrew the July 2018 guidance in May 2021).

The topics listed for Tissue and Advanced Therapies include:

- Considerations for the Development of Human Gene Therapy Products Incorporating Genome Editing; Draft Guidance for Industry;
- Considerations for the Development of Chimeric Antigen Receptor (CAR) T Cell Therapies; Draft Guidance for Industry; and
- Regulation of Human Cells, Tissues, and Cellular and Tissue-Based Products (HCT/Ps) Small Entity Compliance Guide; Guidance for Industry.

America's Blood Centers will continue to provide updates to member blood centers on its advocacy efforts regarding the CBER guidance agenda as they become available. A complete listing of the potential guidances is available on the FDA's website.

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

WORD IN WASHINGTON

A provision allowing blood transport vehicles to use HOV lanes has been included in both the House and Senate surface transportation reauthorization legislation. America's Blood Centers (ABC) has been notified that the provision has bipartisan support. The provision states, "Blood Transport Vehicles — The public authority may allow blood transport vehicles that are transporting blood between a collection point and a hospital or storage center to use the HOV facility if the public authority establishes requirements for clearly identifying such vehicles." ABC, AABB, and the American Red Cross previously sent letters to members of Congress requesting "support and leadership to allow vehicles transporting life-saving blood and blood components to access HOV/carpool lanes." The April 21st letters were addressed to the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works Chair Sen. Tom Carper (D-Del.), Ranking Member Sen. Shelley Moore Capito (R-W.V.), Senate Subcommittee on Transportation and Infrastructure Chair Sen. Ben Cardin (D-M.D.), Ranking Member Kevin Cramer (R-N.D.), House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure Chair Rep. Peter DeFazio (D-Ore.), Ranking Member Rep. Sam Graves (R-M.O.), House Subcommittee on Highways and Transit Chair Rep. Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-D.C.), and Ranking Member Rep. Rodney Davis (R-Ill.). The blood community explained in the letters that "[b]lood center vehicles with access to the HOV lanes will be transporting blood to laboratories for processing or to hospitals to meet patients' needs. Particularly in times of an [expedited] order from hospitals, time is of the essence. Having access to HOV lanes will reduce the current transport time between destinations, maximizing the availability of these lifesaving therapies." The letters described challenges that can be faced in transporting blood products such as "high volume traffic, construction, or possible accidents [which] may clog the roads and surface streets, preventing needed blood and blood components from reaching their destination in a timely manner."

Orion Corp. and the Finnish Red Cross Blood Service are <u>partnering</u> on the development of chimeric antigen receptor (CAR) T-cell cancer therapies. "Targeted immunotherapy has opened up entirely new possibilities for the treatment of cancer, and it is important to advance this development in Finland, too," said Finnish Red Cross Blood Service Senior Medical Officer Matti Korhonen in the <u>news release</u>. "I also believe that as a result of the development work, more and more patients will be able to benefit from this effective treatment." Orion Corp. specializes in the research and development of novel drugs to treat cancer and has expanded its research efforts to include immune-oncology therapies, while cell research is an important part of the ongoing work of the Finnish Red Cross Blood Service.

The South African National Blood Service (SANBS) recently "unveiled" a new facility that will be a "journey of blood" laboratory. "This first-of-its-kind 'journey of blood' destination cent[er] highlights the operating philosophy at SANBS which is underpinned by a focus on long-term sustainability, risk mitigation and a values-based culture cent[ered] on donors, staff and patients," said SANBS Chief Executive Officer Ravi Reddy to News24. The facility is designed to give donors a glimpse of the processing and testing of blood products without physically en-



tering the laboratory space. He added, "[t]he launch of this laboratory highlights our continuous dedication to be sustainable innovators in the industry through our facilities that will benefit our staff, donors, and visitors who will come and 'walk the journey of blood."

Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies is joining the Process Analytical Technology (PAT) Consortium according to a recent announcement. The consortium aims to "increase process efficiency, consistency, and quality while potentially lowering overall costs of cell and gene therapies." PAT is the largest global cell and gene therapy consortium and is led by an independent center for excellence, Cell and Gene Therapy Catapult, which initially formed to advance the United Kingdom (UK) cell and gene therapy sector. The consortium "selected Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies because of previous collaborations evaluating the company's automated cell expansion platform, known as the Quantum® Cell Expansion System, in several applications that included culture of induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSC) and the manufacture of viral vectors. The Cell and Gene Therapy Catapult are currently working in collaboration with Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies to develop a suspension cell expansion protocol relevant to the PAT Consortium project," stated the news release. Terumo Blood and Cell Technologies General Manager of Cell Therapy Technologies Delara Motlagh added in the company news release, "[t]he cell and gene therapy sector has seen increasing clinical, therapeutic, and commercial successes. For this to continue, we need increased collaboration between a range of sector organizations to overcome current industry challenges, including process development. By joining the PAT Consortium, we will contribute, share, and acquire a

broad range of expertise that will have a direct impact on the delivery of therapies to a broader number of patients." The company intends to resume the trials as soon as possible.

bluebird bio, Inc. announced on June 7th that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) removed the clinical hold on the clinical trials for its investigational sickle cell disease therapy and beta-thalassemia candidates. "Patient safety continues to be our utmost priority, and we are grateful for the close partnership with the FDA, investigators, scientists, and most importantly, patients, who all contributed to the assessments of the adverse events in HGB-206 that ultimately led to today's announcement," said Andrew Obenshain, president of Severe Genetic Diseases at bluebird bio, in the news release. "As pioneers in gene therapy, we remain committed to advancing the field through our learnings. Over the past four months, we have gained deeper knowledge and understanding of the pathophysiology of sickle cell disease that will allow us to better serve patients and the broader community. We look forward to resuming our clinical programs and continuing to advance toward major regulatory submissions for sickle cell disease and betathalassemia." The trials had been temporarily paused earlier this year due to reports of a "Suspected Unexpected Serious Adverse Reaction (SUSAR) of acute myeloid leukemia" in a trial participant treated with the therapy (HGB-206) and "a second SUSAR of myelodyplastic syndrome in a participant." After further investigation, the company announced in April that "[t]he case of MDS reported in February...has been further assessed following the review of results from additional tests. The treating investigator has concluded this is not a case of MDS and has revised the diagnosis to transfusion-dependent anemia."

Valneva SE has finished enrollment in a phase III clinical trial of its chikungunya vaccine candidate. According to a company news release, "410 participants aged 18 to 45 years have been randomized in the Phase III trial VLA1553-302 and will be followed for a total of six months. The objective of the trial is to show manufacturing consistency of the vaccine by demonstrating that three consecutively manufactured lots elicit equivalent immune responses measured by neutralizing antibody titers on Day 29 after vaccination. Valneva SE Chief Medical Officer Juan Carlos Jaramillo added in the news release, "[w]e are pleased to have reached this new recruitment milestone. We've now enrolled all participants for both our pivotal Phase 3 trial and lot-to-lot consistency trial so our VLA1553 program is progressing extremely well. Chikungunya virus is a major, growing public health threat and we are looking forward to our top line data this summer." Another phase III is ongoing and completed enrollment April.
